# **REPORTS**

Gabor held an 'All About Water' workshop on 6/23 at his house. He was "delightfully pleased" with how it went. Seven people attended and there was a good discussion and positive feedback. He is currently planning a two-part workshop on blackberry harvesting and jam making/canning. Part 1 (picking) will be on the fourth Saturday of July, part 2 will be on the Sunday (jam and can).

# More Transition Amherst Outings

Gabor also reported that the outreach coordinator of Cowls has offered to lead a Transition Amherst outing through her woods. The walk will be around two hours and will be scheduled for some time after the last planned outing (which is on July 22). Gabor will announce date, time and place once it's confirmed. #### Water Workshop

Bernard would like to organize a water workshop. "Where our water comes from and goes to." John W. said he will be contacting the person who works in the Water Department at the Public Works office in September to coordinate something and hopefully attract students. The workshop will explore where our water comes from, where does it go and what to do we do to it.? John W. noted that there is no way to determine what is actually in our water and thus no way to treat it. Perhaps an hour can be devoted to discussing how the aquifers are being depleted.
