1. We checked in at 7 p.m., and planned the next meeting for 8/16, with Rick facilitating and Steve (tentatively) offering to assist him.

2. Announcements included the "mushroom" walk-about Aug. 5 and the forest walk Aug. 26 with Kate Marquis.
